Farming Hope is growing! With our *new* weekly garden work day at USF, we need a **volunteer to greet and work alongside our homeless hirees.**

This is a flexible role, and can be shared with another volunteer. The garden coordinator will work Thursdays from 12:30-2:30 during our weekly shift at the USF Community Garden, located at the intersection of Turk St. and Tamalpais Terrace.

As a garden co-leader, you will:

- Be on site for the Thursday shift to greet and co-lead planting/harvesting with our team
- Work alongside homeless team members and volunteers
- Coordinate shift activities with professors and garden managers at the start of shift
- Ensure everyone takes a break to chat about life
- **That's it!**

About Farming Hope

We create jobs for transitionally homeless folks, through garden work and pop up restaurants. We need **you** to help us create community during our shared work! Our radical social model gathers unhoused and housed folks on our team and in the garden. We dine on food from our gardens, harvested in part by our homeless team members and volunteers.

Apply if you are

- Self-reliant: Willing to lead a small team of 3-4 individuals
- Respectful: Radically compassionate toward everyone we work with
- Looking for fun work: Enjoy being outdoors (**no** garden experience needed)

Job & Responsibilities

- Volunteer position
- 3 hours per week (or every other week if position is shared)
- Possibility for future employment! For example, fellowship or full-time employment after graduation (we have more and more gardens that need coordinating!)

Benefits

- Be an integral part of a social enterprise combatting homelessness
- Enjoy spectacularly delicious food (garden dinners)
- Work with a diverse, vibrant, woke team re-building community
- Registered 501(c)(3) work can count towards class credit or be paid through a fellowship
- College students are eligible to apply for Community Service Work Study employment

- Community organizing – ask people their needs, and meet them
- Turn “food justice” from a buzzword to reality
- Grow an innovative social enterprise model
